AGRONOMIST AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH SERVICE

Salary Range: \$29,726-\$45,577 per year

Duty Locations: Throughout the nation

Summary: The Agricultural Research Service employs U.S. citizens interested in evaluating forage plants for breeding programs.

Major Duties: The agronomist's duties include developing improved legume cultivars for dry rangelands and irrigated pastures, field planting and harvesting, caring for a greenhouse during winter months and maintaining equipment and records.

FORESTRY TECHNICIAN NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

Salary Range: \$29,726-\$45,577 per year

Duty Locations: CA, WA, OR

Summary: The National Park Service hires candidates who would help preserve the nation's natural and cultural resources. Jobs with the National Park Service often lead to life-long, fulfilling careers.

Major Duties: The technician's primary responsibilities are assisting with wildland fires by evaluating and predicting behavior, preparing and supervising prescribed fires, and hazard fuel reduction projects. The technician is often required to travel to and camp in secluded areas. Duties often include taxing physical activities.

RESOURCE CONSERVATIONIST NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICE

Salary Range: \$54,594 per year

Duty Locations: Throughout the nation

Summary: Coordinate and support the efforts of the Missouri National Recreational River Protection strategies partners to protect, restore and enhance the unchanneled waters of the Missouri River.

Major Duties: The conservationist's duties are serving as liaison with other government agencies, providing technical assistance to local organizations and developing funding strategies and sources.

FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS

- ★ Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.
- ★ An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.
- ★ In FY 2007, **33 federal agencies** provided **6,619 employees** with almost **\$42 million** in student loan repayment.

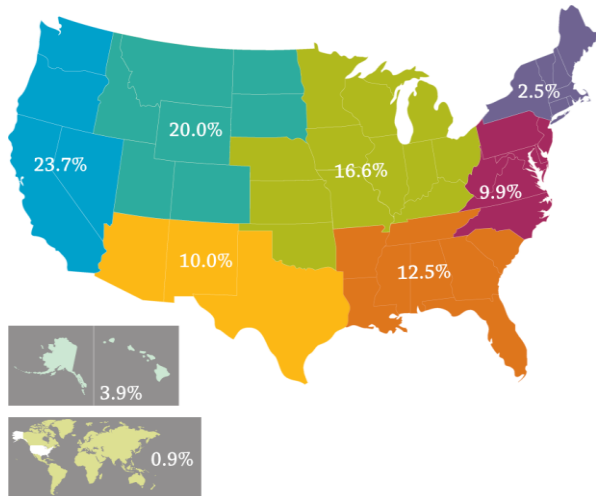

The **National Park Service's** Prince William Forest Park, located in Triangle, VA, offers a sixteen week paid summer internship program for students interested in visitor services. Prince William Forest Park, a unit of the National Park System, consists of more than 15,000 acres of Piedmont and Coast Plain Forest. Duties include staffing the visitor contact station, operating a fee collection station, roving park trails and assisting park visitors with directions, orientation and trail information. WHERE THE JOBS ARE

By September of 2009, our largest federal agencies project that they will hire nearly 193,000 new workers for "mission-critical" jobs.

This includes:

- ★ 1,041 forestry technicians/ specialists at the Department of Agriculture
- ★ 942 agriculture scientists at the Department of Homeland Security
- ★ 771 biological technicians/specialists at the Department of Agriculture
- ★ 378 general biologists at the Department of Health and Human Services
