INTERNATIONAL LIASON SPECIALIST

Salary Range: \$48,100 – \$75,600 per year

Duty Locations: Washington, D.C.

Job Summary: For 200 years, the U.S. Coast Guard has answered the call to serve. Every day, our family of 7,000 civilians helps us save lives, protect the environment, safeguard the nation and stop drug traffickers. In the nation's ports and waterways, along the coast, and on international waters – we are there, always ready.

Major Duties: The specialist will act as liaison with groups outside of the organization to disseminate information about program requirements, make arrangements for special events, coordinate details and logistics, prepare background reports, and work to develop and maintain relationships with stakeholders in various levels of government, private industry and/or universities.

FOREIGN AFFAIRS OFFICER

Salary Range: \$98,000 - \$127,400 per year

Duty Locations: Washington, D.C.

Job Summary: This position is located in the Bureau of International Security and Nonproliferation, Office of Multilateral Nuclear and Security Affairs (ISN/MNSA). This office provides advice, assessments and policy recommendations on a broad range of issues related to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT), nuclear weapon free zones and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

Major Duties: The officer will prepare policy recommendations and suggest negotiating strategies and tactics, as well as set policies in support of diplomatic efforts to promote the acceptance of the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons initiatives. FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS

- ★ Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.
- ★ An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.
- ★ In FY 2007, **33 federal agencies** provided **6,619 employees** with almost **\$42 million** in student loan repayment.

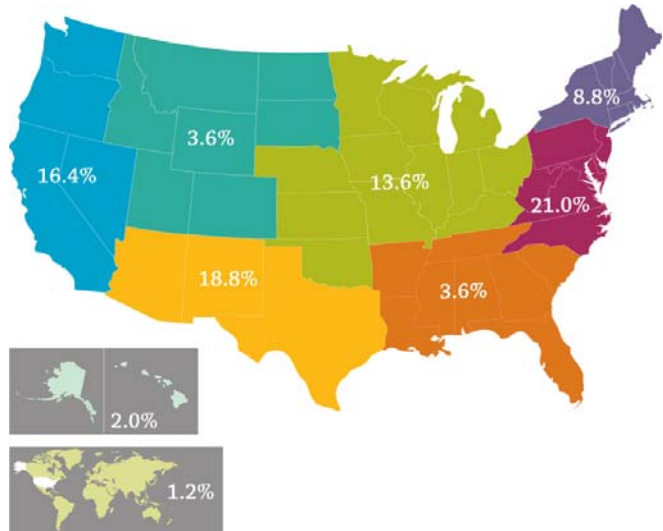

Examples of Internships

An internship at the **U.S. Department of State** is an opportunity for you to get an insider's view of the various types of positions and responsibilities available in international relations. Some interns work in Washington, D.C., and others have the opportunity to work at an embassy overseas. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and accepted or enrolled as degree-seeking students in at least their junior year. Interns must serve for at least ten weeks.

The **National Security Agency's** Intelligence Analysis Summer Program offers college upperclassmen the chance to work in a multi-faceted cryptologic discipline that involves research, analysis and the sharing of findings. An intensive 12-week program for college juniors consists of formal classroom instruction, workshops, and on- and off- site facilities tours. This training is combined with an apprenticeship with senior NSA analysts. Internships are paid and are for a minimum of 12 weeks. Applicants must also be able to receive a security clearance.
