INTERIOR DESIGNER

Salary Range: \$70,405-\$91,531

Duty Location: San Diego, CA

Summary: Discover a civilian career with the U.S. Navy that is full of possibilities, and be a part of something that makes a difference. Interior designers are needed to provide technical, standard and design information as well as assurance for Military Construction projects.

Major Duties: Serve as the Technical Project Manager – Interior Designer, and provide assurances in the areas of code, standard interpretation, design, construction quality, planning, budgeting and programming of shore facilities, as related to interior design. Responsibilities include the execution of highly complex, possibly controversial projects. Will also provide interior design to other teams to help interpret codes, standards and regulations.

VISUAL INFORMATION SPECIALIST

Salary Range: \$69,764-\$90,698

Duty Location: Pentagon, VA

Summary: The Defense Intelligence Agency seeks to provide timely, objective, and cogent military intelligence to warfighters, defense planners, and defense and national security policymakers.

Major Duties: As a visual information specialist, you will design a variety of materials for the DIA, including websites, brochures, multimedia presentations and CD-ROMS, using a variety of software imaging programs such as Photoshop, DreamWeaver and Illustrator. MUSEUM SPECIALIST (ART)

Salary Range: \$48,108-\$62,546

Duty Location: Washington, D.C.

Major Duties: The National Gallery is looking for a Museum Specialist to serve on the Deputy Director's staff in the Loans and Exhibitions Conservation Division. You will be responsible for matting and framing art and using proper conservation techniques, and will oversee the work of others in this area. FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS

- ★ Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.
- ★ An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.
- ★ In 2008, **35 federal agencies** provided **6,879 employees** with almost **\$51 million** in student loan repayment benefits.

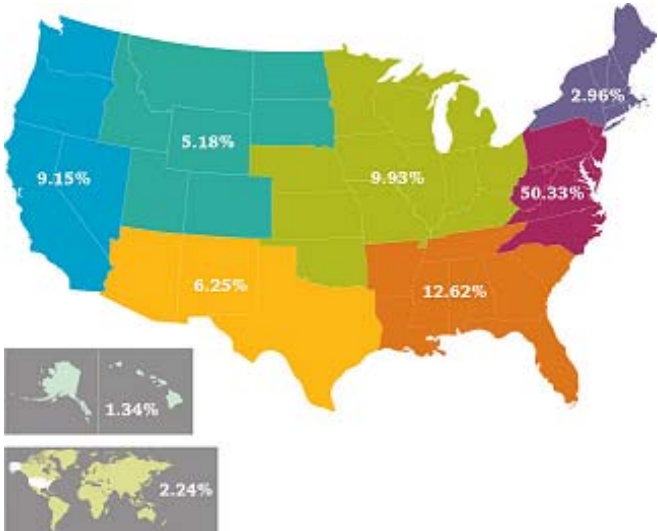

Examples of Internships

The Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden Internships are based in Washington, D.C. Academic credit may be arranged through the intern's school. Interns work extensively within specific departments, as well as with professionals in every area of the museum. From conservation to education to exhibition and design, the Hirshhorn offers internships to cater to many interests. Today many former Hirshhorn interns are curators, educators, public affairs officers and conservators at national and international museums. <http://hirshhorn.si.edu/info/columns.asp?key=91>

The National Gallery Internships are year-long or nine-week summer internships that provide opportunities to work on projects directed by a Gallery curator or department head. Interns will attend biweekly museum seminars that introduce them to the broad spectrum of museum work. The minimum requirement for these internships is a B.A. or B.S., and the year-long programs require at least an M.A. <http://www.nga.gov/education/interned.shtm>
