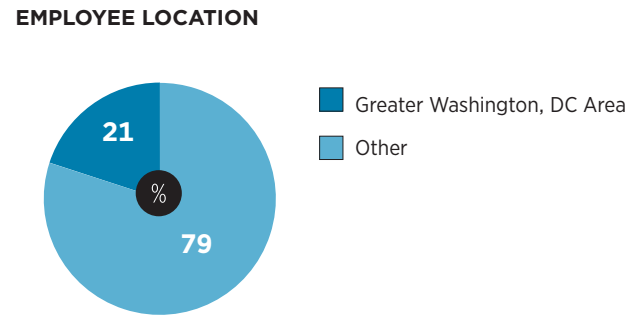

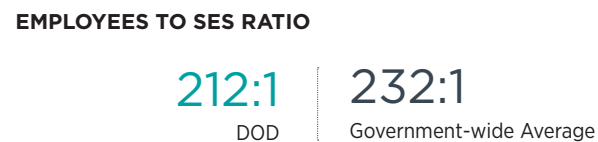

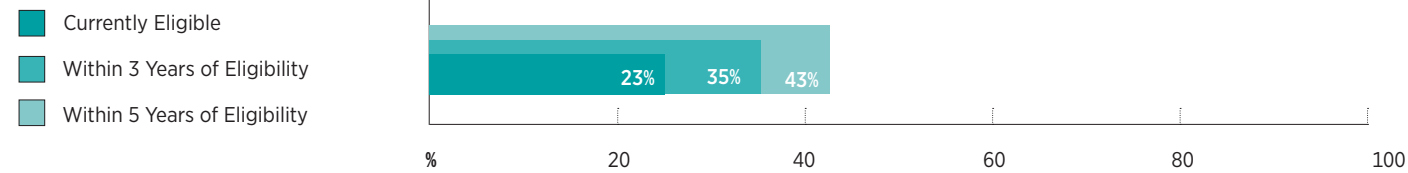

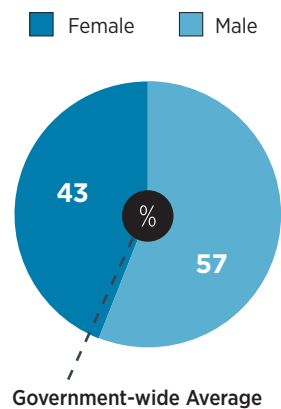
EMPLOYEES ELIGIBLE FOR RETIREMENT



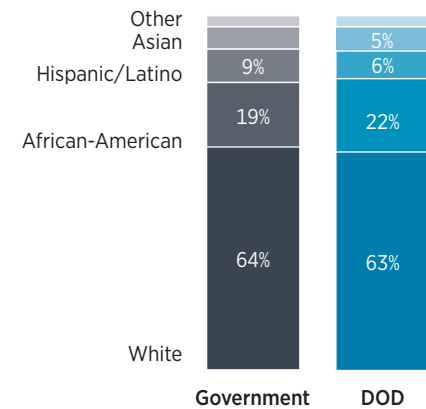

AGENCY VS. GOVERNMENT-WIDE DEMOGRAPHICS

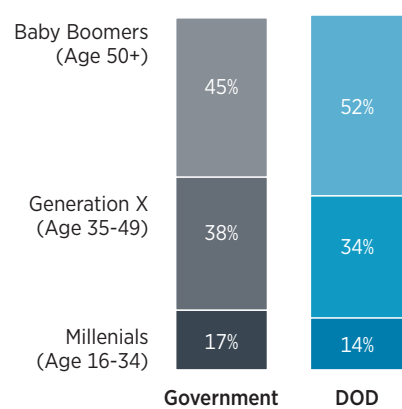
GENDER

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2016 BEST PLACES TO WORK RANKING

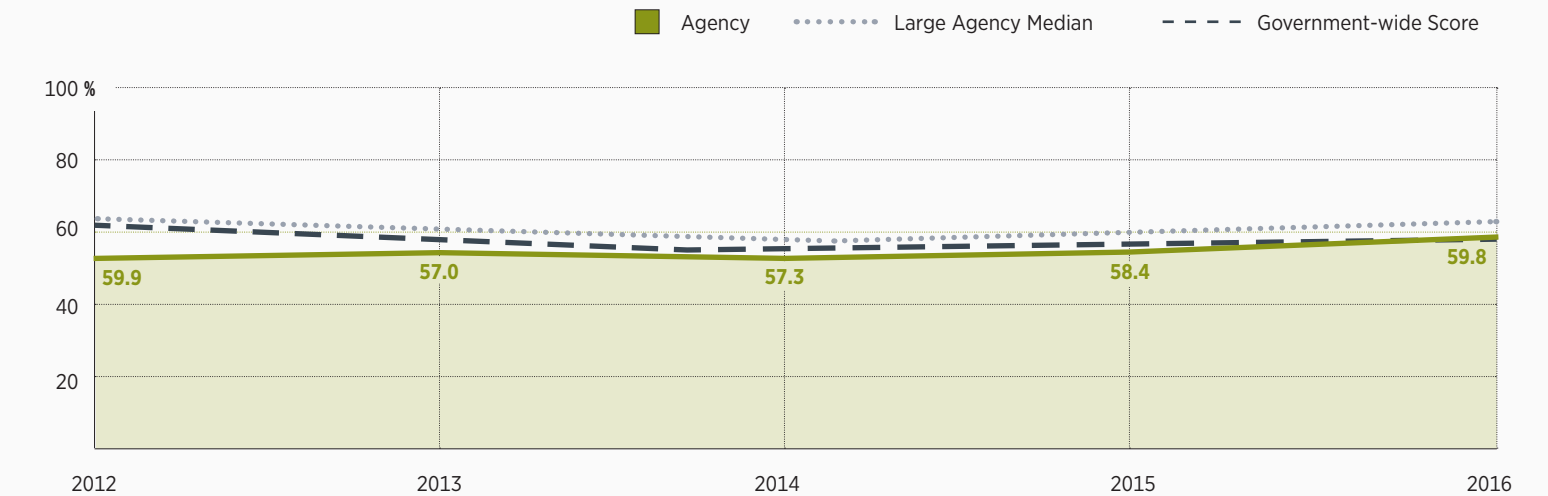
